PARKING LOT WORSHIP CONTINUES ON PENN STREET

Parking Lot Worship at the Penn Street Campus will resume on Sunday, January 3 and continue through January, weather permitting. (Services will not meet if raining or other inclement weather.)

Parking Lot services use radio station 99.9 FM, so that those attending remain in their cars, parked in the two lots directly across from the Sanctuary. Worship leaders are visible from the plaza in front of the Sanctuary. Services last from 30-40 minutes and include scripture, prayers, preaching, and hymns sung safely while remaining in vehicles (*Note: since cars will be parked within 6 feet of each other, masks must be worn if windows are lowered during the service.*) Bulletins are available at fpcfw.org/worship or paper copies are available from greeters in the parking lot. Advance registration is not required, however, those attending agree to remain in their vehicles for the duration of the service as we exercise the maximum in care and concern for the health of one another.

PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends.

It is natural at the beginning of a new year to spend time reflecting on the past year and anticipating what lies ahead. That is certainly true as we leave 2020 and enter into 2021. What a journey we

have been on and continue on in faithfulness. This past year we have endured a once in a century pandemic. We have come through one of the most divided and polarizing elections in memory. We have struggled in deeper, more intense ways with issues of justice in our society. We have had to learn how to be the church in new and creative ways in order to remain connected when we can't be physically gathered. 2020 was a year of challenge on so many levels -all at once.

2020 was also a year of experiencing God's Continued Blessings as First Presbyterian Church. 40 new members joined the congregation, over 30 of them DURING the time we have been worshipping virtually. The Community Crossroads expansion is nearly complete. New ministries of food and hospitality were birthed at Community Crossroads to meet the increased needs in our community. New staff began their ministries at the church. New elders were called and elected by the congregation to begin serving in January. Countless thousands upon thousands of acts of compassion and care have been extended in ways known and unknown as we have continued to serve Jesus in our congregation and community.

2021 is a year of great excitement and anticipation as we prepare to call a new Pastor/ Head of Staff. As access to vaccines begin to expand, we look forward to the day in the not so far off future when we will be able to gather together in person safely for joyful worship, service, nurture, and fellowship. Ministries at Community Crossroads will live into the new and renovated space with extra energy and expanded reach into the community. God will continue deepening our faith - individually and as a congregation. There is much to celebrate in these next months!

As we begin a new year, I hope you will find time to be intentional in your personal reflections on 2020 and your anticipation of 2021 - especially as it relates to your life of faith and how God may be calling to you as you live out your discipleship. Through scripture, devotional readings, prayers, and conversations, I pray a deep and meaningful time of reflection for you. Please know your pastors are here to reflect with you if you would like to talk.

My own reflection in these next weeks will be guided by the text of a hymn I have been contemplating recently. Perhaps the hymn text will inspire your reflection as well. The hymn is Faith Begins by Letting Go, by Carl P. Daw, Jr.

Faith begins by letting go, giving up what had seemed sure, taking risks and pressing on, though the way feels less secure: pilgrimage both right and odd, trusting all our life to God.

Faith endures by holding on, keeping memory's roots alive so that hope may bear its fruit; promise-fed, our souls will thrive, not through merit we possess but by God's great faithfulness.

Faith matures by reaching out, stretching minds, enlarging hearts, sharing struggles, living prayer, binding up the broken parts; till we find the common place ripe with witness to God's grace.

New Bible In Depth Study Begins January 3

Sunday, January 3, at 4.30 p.m., a new Bible in Depth study of the book of Romans will begin via Zoom. Romans is widely considered to be the masterpiece of the apostle Paul's writing. One commentator says that, "It dwarfs most of his other writings, an Alpine peak towering over hills and villages. Not all onlookers have viewed it in the same light or from the same angle, and their snapshots and paintings of it are sometimes remarkably unalike. Not all climbers have taken the same route up its sheer sides, and there is frequent disagreement on the best approach. What nobody doubts is that we are here dealing with a work of massive substance, presenting a formidable intellectual challenge while offering a breathtaking theological and spiritual vision." (N.T. Wright in *The New Interpreter's Bible, Volume X*, Abingdon Press, 2002. p. 395)

Led by the Rev Dr. Michael Waschevski, this verse by verse study of Romans will be one that both inspires and informs our Christian discipleship. COMPANIONS ON THE JOURNEY:

Sundays, January 3 through February 14, 11 a.m.

The spiritual journey into the heart of God has many signposts along the way and many fellow travelers who have lighted the path for those who follow. In this class we will meet several individuals who have been influential teachers throughout the centuries. By listening to the voices from this Great Cloud of Witnesses and learning something of their lives with God, we can find mentors for deepening our own relationship with the Holy and gain insight into the rich history of spiritual disciples in the Christian tradition.

SHALOM:

Sundays, January 10 - February 21, 1 p.m.

Desmond Tutu has written a book, *God Has a Dream*. And in it, he echoes MLK, saying, "God says to you, 'I have a dream. Please help me to realize it. It is a dream of a world whose ugliness and squalor and poverty, its war and hostility, its greed and harsh competitiveness, its alienation and disharmony are changed into their glorious counterparts. When there will be more laughter, joy, and peace, where there will be justice and goodness and compassion and love and caring and sharing. I have a dream that my children will know that they are members of one family, the human family, God's family, my family."

These great men did not make this stuff up. Instead they took a comprehensive look at scripture and recognized that God's vision of how we were to live with one another and with God permeates all of scripture. And they understood that God was serious about birthing this dream into reality. MLK called the dream, "the beloved community;" Desmund Tutu, "Ubuntu." The Old Testament calls it "Shalom;" the New Testament, "Eirene."

In this 6-week course, Carol Toombs will trace God's dream of shalom as it was introduced in Genesis and fulfilled in Revelation, exploring the richness of shalom blessings and the urgency of human responsibility in co-creating it. The course will explore how, through covenants, law, prophets, Jesus Christ, and the early church, God's dream was both kept alive and revealed in ever greater depth.
