On Sunday, March 22, FPC's Session unanimously approved an Updated Approach to Reopening (the full plan is available at fpcfw.org/covid). The Session continues to balance safety for our faith community with pandemic realities. Given the current trends in Tarrant County, the Session is excited to enter Phase Two of the updated plan in April!

Indoor in-person Worship regathers April 11

In addition to continuing online worship, beginning Sunday, April 11, we will regather for indoor worship each Sunday at 9 a.m. in the Great Hall and 11 a.m. in the Sanctuary. Worship will be modified to maintain as safe an environment as possible. Properly worn surgical/cloth masks are required, capacity will be limited to 120 in the Great Hall and 175 in the Sanctuary in order to maintain 6 feet of distance between households, services will last 40-45 minutes, and music will be offered on behalf of the congregation by soloists. Children are invited to attend worship with their household. Parking Lot Worship's last Sunday will be Easter, April 4. (Note: Church School classes will continue to meet online or outdoors through the Spring term.)

Advance registration for worship is required, and will include agreeing to the Covenant of Care. You may register online each week at fpcfw.org/worship or by calling the church office (817.335.1231). Registration opens the Monday of each week. When registering, be sure to add additional attendees at the bottom of the form. If capacity has been reached when you register, you will receive a notification.

Small Groups may meet inside church beginning April 6

Beginning April 6, in addition to meeting outside or online, small groups (under 25 people) may meet inside the church building. Available meeting spaces have been pre-selected in order to maintain 6-foot social distancing between households. Properly worn surgical/cloth masks are required for all FPC meetings. To reserve a meeting space for your group, contact the church office, 817.335.1231.

FPC Regathering INDOORS

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

Where and when can I worship in person?

Beginning Sunday, April 11, we will regather for worship at 9 a.m. in the Great Hall and 11 a.m. in the Sanctuary.

What if I'm not comfortable returning to in-person worship yet?

We completely understand! You are invited to worship online each Sunday at 10 a.m. (visit fpcfw.org/worship for links). The online worship service is also available during the week on YouTube or fpcfw.org.

Do I need to register for worship in advance?

Yes, advance registration is required. You may register online each week at fpcfw.org/worship or by calling the church office (817.335.1231). Registration will open the Monday of each week for the following Sunday. When registering, be sure to add all members of your household or other attendees onto the bottom of the form, so the church has an accurate attendance count.

What if I forgot to register? Can I just show up?

If there are seats available on Sunday morning, you may register in person with an usher prior to worship and sign the Covenant of Care. Seats may not be available on Sunday morning, so advance registration is strongly recommended.

What if I registered, but won't be able to attend?

Please call the church office (817.335.1231) to cancel your reservation and make your seat(s) available for another guest.

Do I have to wear a mask?

FPC is committed to the safety of our faith community and our neighbors. Properly worn surgical or cloth face masks are required for all church events and meetings, including worship. If you forget your mask on Sunday morning, please check with an usher who will be happy to provide one for you.

Will childcare be available?

Children are invited to worship with their families. Childcare will not be available during worship. Childcare is not currently available for small group gatherings or meetings.

How will worship be different?

Worship will be modified to maintain as safe an environment as possible. Capacity will be limited (120 in the Great Hall, 175 in the Sanctuary) to maintain social distancing between households, and services will last 40-45 minutes.

Will we sing hymns and songs?

Music will be offered on behalf of the congregation by soloists and musicians. To minimize risk, congregational and choral singing is currently suspended. (You can always hum along, though!)

Will we pass the offering plate?

In order to maintain as safe an environment as possible, offering plates will not be passed. You are invited to give online (fpcfw. org/give), through the free ShelbyNext membership app, or drop your offering in the baskets available by worship entrances on Sunday mornings.

Can I bring my lunch or cup of coffee?

Due to Covid-19 restrictions and mask-wearing requirements, there is no food or drink at any gatherings, on or off campus, including worship. For small group meetings, individually packaged food for takeaway is available through the FPC kitchen.

Will restrooms be available during worship or for my meeting?

Yes, restrooms will be available near the worship spaces. For an event scheduled at the Penn Street campus, restrooms will be available near your meeting space.

Can I bring a friend, family member, or visitor to worship? Yes! All visitors must register in advance and sign the Covenant of Care.

So what's the deal on small groups?

Beginning April 6, small groups (under 25 people) may meet inside the church building. Outdoor small group gatherings (under 25 people) or online gatherings are also available.

Where can my small group gather?

Several indoor meeting spaces have been pre-selected in order to maintain 6-foot social distancing between households: Gym, Great Hall, 235, 237, Youth Suite, and the West Concourse. There are five outdoor locations available on the Penn Street campus: in front of sanctuary entrance doors facing Penn Street, the Memorial Garden, the Great Hall covered drive, the north porch in front of the Bride's Room, and the parking lot across from the Parlor door on Penn Street. You may also schedule outdoor events off campus, such as at a local park or a church member's vard, or online.

How do I schedule my group?

Please call the church office (817.335.1231).

Does everyone in my group have to register in advance?

Yes. The church office will set up a registration form and provide you with the link for your group members to register and sign the Covenant of Care. Anyone without internet access may register by calling the church office.

I just returned from a trip and spent time with several other families. Is it ok for me to attend worship or a gathering?

As we exercise care for one another, please be mindful of your level of exposure to other households prior to attending any FPC gatherings, as that increases risk for others. We also ask that if you are awaiting a Covid test result, you promise to stay home.

What steps has the church taken to maintain a safe environment?

FPC is committed to the health and safety of our faith community. Enhanced cleaning and sanitation protocols have been in effect on our campus since 2020. All worship and meeting spaces are cleaned and sanitized before and after gatherings. Masks and social distancing are required, and hand sanitizers are available near all entrances. Advance registration for all gatherings provides an accurate headcount, as well as contact tracing (should that become necessary). We also encourage everyone to register for the Covid-19 vaccine through Tarrant County (tarrantcounty.com/covidshot).



FPC ENCOURAGES YOU TO REGISTER FOR THE COVID-19 VACCINE

The State of Texas is distributing the Covid-19 vaccine. All adults (16 and up) are now eligible for vaccination, and anyone in Tarrant County may register for the vaccine and be placed on a waitlist. In order to protect ourselves and our community, First Presbyterian Church's Wellness Committee is encouraging everyone to register. Once you have registered, you will receive confirmation that you are on the waiting list. You will be notified when your initial vaccination date has been scheduled.
