TIP OF THE MONTH

Wellness is not merely the absence of disease or infirmity; it is a state of complete physical, mental, social wellbeing. Wellness is the act of practicing habits on a daily basis to attain better physical, and mental

outcomes, so that instead of just surviving you are thriving! Several key lifestyle areas are considered dimensions of overall wellness, including: social connectedness, exercise, nutrition, sleep and mindfulness. Start with small changes:

- Social connectedness: Take a few minutes a day to call someone.
- Exercise: Even 20-30 minutes of daily exercise can have a positive impact on your physical health and improve your mood.
- Nutrition: choose an apple and/or raw vegetables for a snack.
- Sleep: Avoid caffeine after 12 noon, include quiet and calm activities before going to bed, wake up at the same time each day.
- Mindfulness/meditation: Consider your own mind and how you are feeling. Consider journaling these thoughts and feelings.
