Something New is Coming to FPC!

In response to PC(USA)'s Matthew 25 Initiative and its emphasis on facilitating personal transformation, the Spiritual Formation Subcommittee of Adult Christian Nurture is inaugurating a new venue for adult education, The School of Spiritual Formation.

Whereas everything we do and learn here at FPC can be formative, the current time frame of 45-minute class periods does not lend itself to the depth experiences conducive to Christian transformation, the letting go of the power of our ego-selves and the putting on of ever-greater Christ-likeness. It is this transformation that Paul alludes to when he says, "it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me." (Galatians 2.20) It is this journey into a Christ-centered life that the spiritual journey is all about.

Classes offered in the School of Spiritual Formation will directly address this transformational process. They will be 1.5 hours long, a time frame that will allow for experiential learning and depth reflection. They will be offered on Sunday mornings, and will work this way:

- Participants will covenant to worship together at one of the three worship services.
- They will attend class for 90 minutes during the time the other two services meet.
- Scheduling will be rotated so that congregants can worship at their preferred service and still have an opportunity to experience all content over time.
- This format will begin on December 5, with the start-up of the winter quarter.

Watch for the upcoming curriculum catalogue around the church, and for the winter schedule in upcoming newsletters.

The First Christmas Book Study: October 24 through December 19

As we enter Advent, please consider joining a small group reading experience revolving around the familiar stories of Christ's birth. Are we too familiar with these stories? Do we connect with the emotional power of these incarnational stories about the beginnings of the Christ story and the Christ life? Or, are we so caught up in the cultural busyness of the season that we overlook what's really there in the gospel text?

Join us for a 12-week study of *The First Christmas* by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan. Together, Borg and Crossan trace the historical and theological meanings of these stories with a focus on understanding what they suggest for religious commitment today. 
