PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends,

As you read this article, we are entering the season of Advent. November 28 is the first Sunday in Advent - the liturgical season which prepares us for the celebration of Christmas. Advent is a season of expectant hope where we once again prepare ourselves to celebrate the mystery of Christmas, the Incarnation, God with Us.

Might I suggest that as we enter this Advent, we take time to be attentive not to how we prepare ourselves, but to how God is preparing us as we engage in the rhythm of worship, study, reflection, care, and service through First Presbyterian Church. Christian Educator Maria Harris wrote in her classic book Fashion Me a People, that we are formed in our faith through the ongoing life of the church. All areas of the church's life shape and

God is actively preparing us to experience the mystery of the Incarnation at Christmas in ever deepening ways. Year-End Giving Reminder

Please keep the following guidelines in mind when planning your year-end giving to First Presbyterian.

You must deliver or mail (and postmark) checks on or by December 31, 2021, to claim a charitable contribution deduction for 2021. Although checks in the offering on the first Sunday in 2022 can be recorded to fulfill a 2021 pledge to the church, they will not qualify for an IRS charitable contribution deduction for 2021, even if the check is predated to 2021 or actually written in 2021. However, checks that are written, mailed, and postmarked in 2021 will be deductible, even though they were not received by the church until 2022. To ensure the deductibility of your church contributions under current IRS guidelines, please do not file your 2021 income tax return until you have received a written acknowledgement of your contributions from the church. Some of your contributions may not be tax deductible if you file your return before receiving a written acknowledgement of vour contributions.

Note about Online Gifts: Online gifts will be credited according to the date and time the online gift is submitted.

SHALOM: Desmond Tutu wrote a book, *God Has a Dream*. In it, he echoes MLK, saying, "God says to you, 'I have a dream. Please help me to realize it. It is a dream of a world whose ugliness and squalor and poverty, its war and hostility, its greed and harsh competitiveness, its alienation and disharmony are changed into their glorious counterparts. When there will be more laughter, joy, and peace, where there will be justice and goodness and compassion and love and caring and sharing. I have a dream that my children will know that they are members of one family, the human family, God's family, my family."

These great men took a comprehensive look at scripture and recognized that God's vision of how we were to live with one another and with God permeates all of scripture. MLK called the dream, "the beloved community;" Desmund Tutu, "Ubuntu." The Old Testament calls it "Shalom;" the New Testament, "Eirene."

This 8-week course will trace God's dream of shalom as it was introduced in Genesis and fulfilled in Revelation, exploring the richness of shalom blessings and the urgency of human responsibility in co-creating it. The course will explore how, through covenants, law, prophets, Jesus Christ, and the early church, God's dream was both kept alive and revealed in ever greater depth.

Carol Toombs will lead this journey through scripture on Sunday mornings, December 5 through January 30, from 10-11:30 a.m. in Room 100. Participants will covenant to worship together at the 9 a.m. service.

LECTIO DIVINA COVENANT GROUP: Lectio, or devotional reading of scripture, is a time-honored way of allowing God to speak to you directly through the words of scripture. All of us have experienced reading the same scripture at different times in our lives and hearing it altogether differently. This is because God's word is an Incarnate Word which meets us where we are.

In this covenant group, members will be encouraged to: Notice God's action in their life. Pay attention to signs of God's grace in life's ordinary events. Respond to God's invitations to be about the Spirit's work of love and justice in all of life's dimensions. This is done through the reading of scripture in which one focuses on a word or phrase in the Bible passage that speaks to their heart. By slowing down and following the four steps of lectio: reading, meditating, praying, and resting in God, we allow God to touch us in our depths.

This class runs December 5 through January 30, from 10-11:30 a.m. in Room 240. We will covenant to worship together at the 9 a.m. service.




STOCKING PROJECT



We will offer first and second doses of Moderna, Pfizer, and Johnson & Johnson Covid-19 vaccines, and booster shots. Everyone 5 years of age and older is now eligible for vaccination. If you have been fully vaccinated, you may be eligible for a booster.

Please bring ID (for children, a vaccine record with their birthdate or a birth certificate) and your vaccination card (if you have one). Pre-registration is not required.



Voter registration will also be available.
