BIBLE IN DEPTH WINTER TERM

Bible in Depth studies a book of the Bible verse by verse. While a relatively short book (6 chapters), Galatians is theologically rich as Paul articulates the early church's understanding of God's grace manifested in Christ – especially concerning Gentiles and the keeping of Mosaic law. You may submit your suggestions online at fpcfw.info/eldernominations. Paper forms will also be available at worship services during January.





Samaritan House supports vulnerable individuals and families as they move toward independence by providing housing, resources, and hope. Samaritan House was established in 1991 in Tarrant County to provide housing to persons living with HIV/AIDS. Samaritan House expanded their mission to provide affordable and supportive housing to additional vulnerable populations in Tarrant County, including the medically or mentally fragile, the chronically unhoused, and those with lowincomes. Resident Services were added to improve housing stability for residents of other affordable housing properties.

The February 21 Tuesday Together program will be on New Leaf Community Services and the Quail Trail housing project.


